A bit of my story—

I was baptized as an infant into a Christian family, and I "asked Jesus into my heart" when I was five, though I don't remember either moment. I do remember, a couple years later, waking up weeping in the middle of the night as I felt "how much Jesus did for me on the cross." Later, as a fourteen-year-old standing among tens of thousands at Creation '92 on a hillside in Mt. Agape, Pennsylvania, I sang along with a praise band proclaiming, "We place You in the highest place above all else in the land." God used those silly lyrics to challenge my heart, and I intentionally decided that yes, indeed, Jesus would be Lord over all of my life.

I grew up in Newark, Delaware. We were part of a Presbyterian church until. after my parents faced the difficult pain of church politics, we began attending a Bible Fellowship church when I was nine. I went to Christian school up through eighth grade, and then the local public high school. Throughout middle school I'd had an unrequited crush on a classmate; we would be going to different high schools, so I started attending her United Methodist youth group. There I found a wonderful Christian community (although not a date). I grew in my faith, and began to lead Bible studies. The summer after graduating high school, the pastor hired me as an intern to do odd jobs that exposed me to ministry.

I had decided to go to the local University of Delaware as a missionary, to be "salt and light." But whatever I wanted to do for God paled in comparison to what God wanted to do in me! I learned a lot and grew as I explored different churches and campus ministries (Lutheran, Episcopal, Baptist, the Vineyard). But especially through InterVarsity Christian Fellowship I found true Christian fellowship and opportunities to serve in ministry leading small groups, prayer groups, and mentoring younger students. More than anything else, though, after a long period of spiritual dryness, Christ encountered me in a deep and transformative way that felt like being born again.

I met Jan at InterVarsity the second week of freshman year. I was smitten instantly; she took a few years to come around. We spent our first year of marriage in North Plainfield, New Jersey, where Jan was working as a high school math teacher, and then moved to Wilmore, Kentucky, to attend Asbury Theological Seminary. Jan earned a degree in pastoral counseling: I entered the United Methodist ordination process, served a small country church for two years, and worked as a hospital chaplain. I intended to go on for doctoral work in Biblical studies, but wasn't accepted; further school at Princeton was needed first. I hoped to pastor part-time during school, but a biased district superintendent filed my resume in the trashcan. So, five years after moving to Kentucky, with degrees and a daughter in hand, we returned to New Jersey to live with Jan's parents, her sister, her grandfather, and three cats that didn't get along.

Some months later, a more openminded superintendent sent Jan and I to share an associate minister position in Haddonfield, New Jersey, where Josiah was born. Then Boston College admitted me to their doctoral program, so we sojourned in Massachusetts for three years with two kids, no money, and a lot of stress. Toby was a few years early, so in 2013 we moved back to New Jersey where I served a twopoint charge in poverty-stricken Millville; Î was ordained in 2016. After two "have I got a deal for you!" calls from the bishop, we served three years in suburban Williamstown and two years in rural Aldine; fortunately, our kids were able to stay at the same local Christian school, where Jan spent seven years teaching high school math. And now we're excited to begin this new adventure serving Trinity!
