Dear Friends in Christ.

What is a church at its best?

"They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers. And fear came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were happening through the apostles. All who believed were together and held everything in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute them to all, as any had need. Day by day, both being devoted with one mind in the temple and breaking bread from house to house, they shared in their meals with joyful and sincere hearts. praising God and having the favor of the whole people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved." (Acts 2:42-47)

Luke here depicts the ideal church. After Jesus ascended into heaven, he poured out the Holy Spirit upon his disciples (Acts 2:1–12, 33). When the crowds wondered what was going on, Peter preached a rousing sermon and three thousand new believers joined Jesus' small community of 120 (2:14–41). And then Luke gives this description of the church in 2:42–47, using terms familiar to his readers as a description of an ideal community. This was the kind of community that both the Greek and Roman philosophers and many early Jews aspired to become:

This church is devoted. They spend their time in worship of God and fellowship with one another. They listen to the apostles' teaching, which we find today in the New Testament. They regularly break bread at the Lord's Table. They not only give to missions—they even sell their possessions to help care for those in need!

This church is powerful. The church began with weird happenings—the sound of rushing wind, tongues of fire on peoples' heads, praising God in unknown languages (2:2-4); now miraculous signs and wonders continue through the apostles. We'll soon hear of the lame walking (3:7–8) and the sick healed (5:14-16). The world around takes notice, and is filled with fearful awe (2:43).

This church is united. Luke goes out of his way to emphasize the unity of this church. "They were together" and "they held everything in common" (2:44); they are "with one mind" (or "same-passioned"—not so much thinking the same as feeling the same) as they gather for worship at the temple and for breaking bread in their homes (2:46). They are so united that they hold their possessions in common and share their meals together (2:44, 46). Unity of spirit even leads to unity of wallet!

This church is growing. "And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved." The risen and ascended Lord Jesus, who continues to speak and act throughout the book of Acts, is here bringing new people to this small community. Not simply new "members," in the sense of new names on rosters or butts in pews or envelopes in plates, but "those being saved." Jesus adds to this community more people who are leaving behind their past and their culture, choosing to obey Peter's exhortation a few verses earlier: "Be saved from this corrupt generation!" (2:40).

Over the next few months, we'll explore this picture of the ideal church. I'll be preaching about some of the practices of these early believers, the things they did that helped form them into the kind of community where God was at work. What might happen if we do what they did? Might God do in our midst what God did in theirs? Would you pray with me that God would continually form us into such a church—devoted, powerful, united, growing?


TRUNK OR TREAT (tentative)
